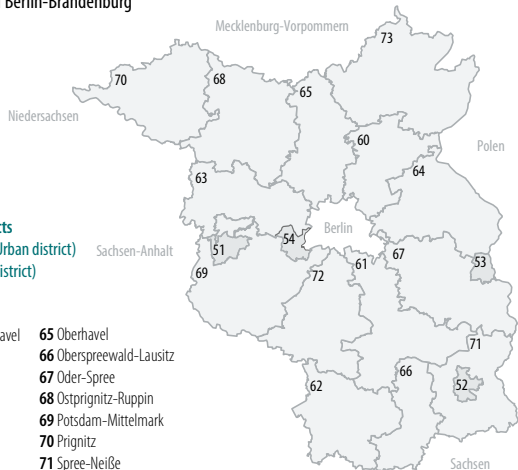

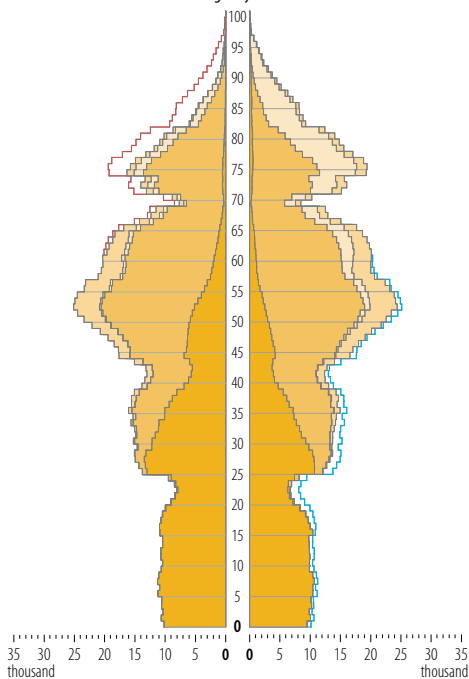

by age and marital status

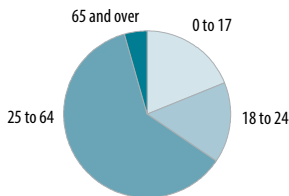

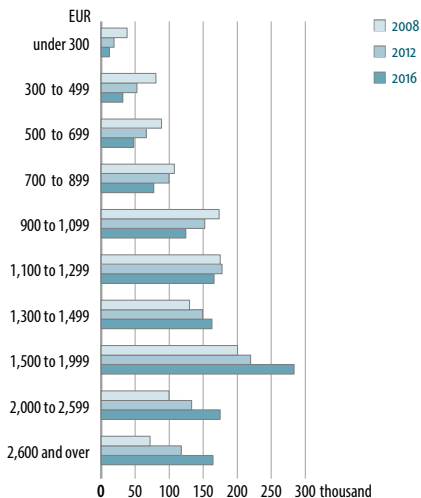

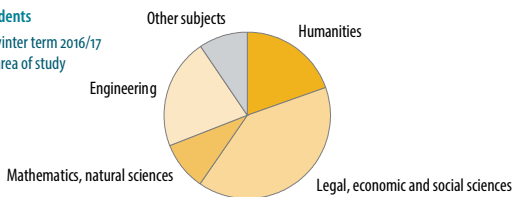

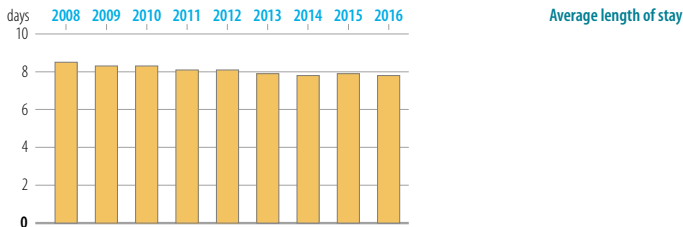

change on same month of previous year



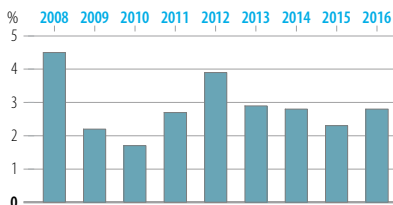
